

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Q: What should I wear to Court?

A: Whenever you attend a Court Hearing it is important to show respect for the Court. I usually advise people that the best way to dress is to dress as if you were having an important business meeting with your boss or attending an important service such as a Wedding or a Church service.

2. Q: Where is the Court house?

A: Most of our cases are in the Rancho Cucamonga Superior Court, San Bernardino Superior Court, Riverside Superior Court or Pomona Superior Court. Enclosed herewith is a map to each of the four Courthouses listed below.

3. Q: Where do I meet Mr. Kenny?

A: The best place to meet Mr. Kenny is either in the Courtroom where your case is assigned or in the hallway outside of the Courtroom. There will

be occasions where Mr. Kenny will not be able to be at the Courthouse at the exact time when your case is scheduled to be heard. Mr. Kenny's office keeps in contact with the Clerk and Opposing Counsel and appries them as to what time he will arrive. Your hearing will not start before Mr. Kenny arrives and you will have an opportunity to speak with him before the hearing if necessary.

4. Q: May I bring my Child with me to Court?

A: Children are not allowed in the individual Courtrooms. If you bring your Child to a Court preceding you will also have to bring someone else who can watch your Child in the hallway. Unless you are instructed otherwise it would be preferable if you would find someone to watch your Child rather than bring him/her to Court with you.

5. Q: Can I bring a Friend or Relative with me To Court?

A: Court proceedings are among the most stressful events that you will ever experience in your life. Anything that can help you feel more relaxed and more comfortable is a good thing. We would suggest that a Friend or Relative accompany you to Court whenever possible. Please let your Friend or Relative know that in most cases the Courtrooms are not large enough to accommodate anyone other then the parties themselves and that your Friend or Relative may have to wait in the hallway.

6. Q: Do I have to be in Court for the next Hearing?

A: It is always a good idea that you plan to attend every Court Hearing. The minutes of each Court hearing reflects who was present and who was not present. Unless you are instructed otherwise you should plan to attend every Court Hearing.

7. Q: Are we still going to Court on _____?

A: Many times cases are continued for various reasons. It may well be that your case will be continued even on the day that it is scheduled. When that happens those continuances are generally beyond our control. We endeavor to stay in contact with you to let you know when and if your case will be continued. Unless you hear from us you should assume that your case will proceed as scheduled.

8. Q: Have we received the information from Dr. or Mr./Mrs. _____?

A: Our office practice is to send you a copy of every piece of incoming mail shortly after we receive it. At such time as we have the information you can be reasonably assured that you will have the information within a few days thereafter.

9. Q: What happened in Court?

A: Often times the proceedings that take place in Court are confusing at best for people to understand. For that reason we make an attempt to write a letter to each client after the Court Hearing letting them know what the results were that took place in Court. You should expect to receive that letter within 7-10 days after your Court Hearing.
